Comments on the new Tax Cut and Jobs Act (H.R. 1) recently passed by the US Congress

After reading several summaries and reports by financial advisors and tax experts, I urge you to pass this information along to your congregation ASAP via e-sources regarding charitable contributions. Also, share it on Sunday morning with a way for anyone not prepared to give then be able to bring such contributions before the end of the day. Primarily, this affects only those who itemize their deductions.

**SUGGESTION:** IF YOU GENERALLY FILE TAXES USING SCHEDULE A, ITEMIZED DEDUCTIONS, you will be wise to pay forward charitable contributions now before the end of 2017. The Tax Cut and Jobs Acts (H.R. 1) recently passed by congress makes some serious changes that will effect charitable contributions. There are other changes that are not addressed here.

In 2018 the standard deduction will be raised significantly and may wipe out the value of itemized deductions. Therefore, any advance contributions in 2017 will have value now that may not have value for your 2018 taxes. E-contributions made no later than December 31 are acceptable.

In addition, the wise Finance Committee will note such extra contributions and provide a way to preserve these funds to be used throughout 2018 and not spend the funds prematurely.
