Holy Friendship

As Bishop Sharma Lewis reminds Virginia United Methodists, **disciples** of the Lord Jesus Christ seek to be **life-long learners who influence others to serve**. One of the distinctive marks of early Wesleyan discipleship is the class meeting or small group. Anyone could join a small group. One only had to have a desire for salvation --- to turn from sin, to trust and follow Jesus. To remain vital in the small group, however, a disciple had to be open and accountable to God and to others in prayer, discernment, and in holy friendship. Dr. Greg Jones, former Dean of Duke Divinity School describes holy friendship as **“watching over one another in love** under the leadership of the Holy Spirit. He identifies **three things Holy Friends do**.

Holy Friends 1) Challenge us to **deal with the sins** we’ve come to love or with which we begin to feel a measure of comfort. We may try to “clean” our failings up a bit by renaming these familiar sins. “Workaholic” becomes ... “working hard for the kingdom, for the time is short.” “Destructive gossip” can surface under the guise of “sharing prayer requests”. You get the picture. True friends help us to tell and live the truth, truth which sets us free (John 8:31-32).

Holy Friends 2) Help us **Affirm Gifts** we’re afraid to claim. Others can sometimes see gifts in us we cannot see in ourselves. True friends urge us to use these gifts prayerfully --- to build up the body of Christ for the Great Commission: reaching, teaching, and serving, pointing others to Jesus, all with great love. (Matthew 28:18-20)

Holy Friends 3) **Dream God’s Dreams** together... **and pursue them by faith!** They help us discern how the Spirit of God is leading us into a future filled with hope **as revealed in the Lord Jesus Christ**. Discipleship happens in **Christ-centered communities of faith!** As we move forward, it’s a great joy to see members of discipleship groups **challenging** one another to speak and live the truth, **supporting** one another in using the gifts God has given, and **urging** all to pursue God’s dreams! (Colossians 1:27-28; I Corinthians 15:58) Holy Friends in Christ Jesus, may we see in the pages of this newsletter and beyond, God’s dreams for His church and be energized and encouraged. In every change God faithful will remain! (Hymn: *Be Still, My Soul*)

New date for the Glad Hatters' Tea: **Sunday, September 9**, 12:15 pm in Social Hall. This event will be a kick-off for UMW's year, which begins in September. Sign up sheets and publicity will be forthcoming.

Kits for Conference: UMW members are collecting "ingredients" and assembling health kits and school kits for Annual Conference again this year. List of needed items is being included in the Sunday bulletins, and the collection tub is in the Missions Hallway. Assembly of kits will be at the May UMW meeting, May 16. The kits will be blessed at the altar the first Sunday in June, and then taken to Annual Conference June 15 – 17. UMW will also be contributing \$650.00 to UMCOR, to cover the cost of providing 10 fully-equipped flood buckets.

Applications are being accepted for the Lorraine Sperlazza Scholarship, which is awarded each year to a graduating high school young woman member of St. Matthias. Applicants are required to write a letter/resume detailing their accomplishments and future goals and describing how their membership at St. Matthias has helped them with those achievements and goals. The scholarship will be awarded on the first Sunday in June.

In response to a request from WGO, UMW will be contributing curtains for kids' rooms to the Honduras Mission Team. Some of the women are sewing the curtains; others are providing financial support for the purchase of fabric or the curtains themselves. The curtains consist of two panels, 32" wide and 40" long, in patterns suitable for children, from infants to teens. We are looking for people to sew the curtains, or to donate money for fabric or fabric itself. **POC:** Karen Breggenti or Sherry King.

UMW is also supporting our Honduras Mission Team with the donation of 250 eyeglass cases, donated by a local eye doctor. Watch for additional needed items, such as over-the-counter medications for the team to take with them to be dispensed in the medical clinic in Honduras.

UMW has donated \$400 to All God's Children's summer camp program, which is a camp experience for children of incarcerated parents. \$400 is the cost for one child to attend camp for one week, and UMW is continuing in their support of this very worthwhile ministry.

As you can see, UMW has been able to be very mission-minded, thanks to the generosity and support of the St. Matthias family! Thank you for purchasing Easter baskets and spring and Easter crafts; this makes it possible for us to "share the wealth" and support the needs of others in our community, in the nation and in the world. We are always looking for women to join us for craft workshops (instruction given, talent not necessarily needed!) and for our monthly meetings, usually on the second Wednesday of the month, 10 am, Social Hall. Come and see what UMW is all about; a warm welcome awaits you!

Kerry Meyer Awarded Fulbright Scholarship

Congratulations and God's blessings to Fulbright Scholar Kerry Meyer! Kerry was recently contacted by our U.S. State Department of being awarded the prestigious Fulbright Scholarship. Starting in September, she will be conducting graduate research through the University of Bristol in the United Kingdom. Her research will deal with volcanos in Africa and Central America. Using new technology to study, the hope is to improve eruption forecasts and make better predictions...especially in heavily populated areas.

Her husband Colin writes, "Much, much more than this award itself, God has blessed Kerry and I over the past year, so that we can honestly testify that 'God works all things together for the good of those who love Him.'" (Romans 8:28) This year, the Meyers have been living the words of the beloved hymn, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" *Have we trials and temptations? / Is there trouble anywhere? / We should never be discouraged - Take it to the Lord in prayer. / Can we find a friend so faithful, / Who will all our sorrows share?*

MISSION MOMENT

Our church participates in many missions. You can open our updated Mission Booklet to see all the things we do. I often hear others saying “Our church is so mission-minded. We do so much for others!” And I believe that is very true. As we serve in all the different missions that our church supports, I ask you – How do we prepare for mission? Whether we are traveling to a foreign country, serving in our local community or just walking down the hall of our church, we have to be prepared to be a missionary and do the work of missions. Being prepared is required for any mission, from volunteering in the Food Pantry, cooking dinner at Thurman Brisben Center, or packing food bags for Heartwood Ministries.

I’ve been reading a devotional in preparation for our mission trip to Honduras entitled *Before You Go* by Jack Hempfling. This will be my 4th trip to Honduras and this is my 4th time reading this devotional but I still learn something new each time I read it! In the introduction, the author explains how to prepare for mission in 3 steps.

Step 1: We have to prepare our body by eating right, getting in shape (work in progress!), and getting prepared for the weather, bugs, etc...

Step 2: We must prepare our minds. We do this by learning about our mission, studying about the mission’s purpose, needs and actions, and getting to know and respect the people we will be serving.

Step 3: The third and most important step is to prepare our hearts for the mission. Hempfling says “It is imperative that you take opportunity to draw close to Christ in the days preceding your mission trip. It is HIS strength, anointing, and power that you and your team need to leave anything of eternal value.” As I read that quote, for the 4th time, I realized that it is imperative that we prepare our hearts for all missions that our church family undertakes. We are God’s team in service and we must be prepared in all we do when serving others! This means praying consistently for the people who come to our food pantry, praying for the residents at the homeless shelter, praying for the students who will be receiving the bags of food through Heartwood Ministries. It also means that we need to prepare our hearts to share the love of Jesus Christ with those whom we make contact. Our involvement in missions is a work of the Heart! God may be calling YOU to be part of one or more missions, in our church or elsewhere. Spend time with God when preparing for any mission that you participate in by diving into God’s Word, fasting, and praying. Listen for God’s direction and when He says “Whom shall I send?” you will have an open and willing heart to say “Here I am Lord, send ME!”

Food Pantry News – Because of your generosity, the Food Pantry has received donations that will allow us to purchase needed food and other items for the pantry. In 2017, we had 106 visits to the Food Pantry. This number represents approximately 6 different families throughout the year. We serve several different people/families on an ongoing basis and last week we served 6 families. We also prepare holiday baskets at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. We would love to expand the number of families we serve. Joe Dunkin Scholarship

The United Methodist Men annually accept applications for a \$500 scholarship to a graduating senior from the congregation, in memory of Joe Dunkin. Joe, retired from the Stafford High School, was a long time member of the Church, a spiritual leader to many and a tenor in the Church Choir. In his 80's, Joe's voice could still make the building reverberate to his song.

Young men wishing to apply need to submit a free form essay discussing your faith and church involvement, community and school extracurricular activities, collegiate plans; and what you see as God's calling for your future.

Essays should be submitted in hard copy to the either the Church Office or dropped in the United Methodist Men (UMM) mailbox; and by email attachment sent to Mr. Matt McBride at mattmcb29@verizon.net. Essays should be submitted no later than May 25th. Presentation of the scholarship will be during a worship service in June.

FINANCE

Financial reports for the end of the first quarter of 2018 are completed. The chart below reflects our status in each major line item category. Overall, we have used about 17% of the budget which puts us in good financial standing for this year. Our net income for the end of the first quarter was \$5,440.

The Finance Committee has transitioned to using QuickBooks for budgeting and financial reporting purposes, which has streamlined many of our reports. In addition, as a result of the recent audit of our books, we are finalizing guidelines for financial policies and procedures. They will be made available to the congregation as soon as they are approved by this committee and the Administrative Council.

SCRIP sales have been declining recently and two of the four volunteers who sell the cards are now unable to continue. Therefore, we will sell the cards that we have on hand until they are gone. We may decide to continue this service in the future, but for now, there isn't enough interest in the program to keep it worth our time and effort as we only realize a profit of about 2-3 percent.

Our meetings are open to all and are held on the second Wednesday of each month at 7pm in room 10.
